MPO RESOLUTION 2021-11

RE:	AMENDMENT TO THE FY 2021-2024 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM
WHEREAS	the Federal Highway Act of 1962, as amended, and the Urban Mass Transportation Act of 1964, as amended, provide for an urban transportation planning process; and
WHEREAS	the Fixing America's Surface Transportation (FAST) Act currently authorizes funding to improve our nation's transportation system for highways, highway safety, public transit, alternative non-motorized forms of transportation, and freight; and
WHEREAS	the Fixing America's Surface Transportation (FAST) Act and its predecessors, require a Long-Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) as well as a Transportation Improvement Program (TIP); and
WHEREAS	the Region 1 Planning Council is the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) for the Rockford Urban and Metropolitan Area, and the MPO Policy Committee has the specific responsibility to direct and administer the continuing urban transportation planning process: and
WHEREAS	the MPO Policy Committee has adopted the August 31, 2020 version of the Fiscal Year 2021-2024 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) and;
WHEREAS	the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) have approved the FY 2021-2024 MPO TIP; and
WHEREAS	Illinois Department of Transportation has requested an amendment to the TIP for the purpose of the updating project costs and inclusion of a new project, Boone County Highway Department has requested an update to project costs, and Rockford Mass Transit District has requested the inclusion of seven projects and updates to project costs; and
WHEREAS	the projects being amended in the adopted and approved version of the FY 2021-2024 TIP will not affect or impact the other projects listed in the FY 2021-2024 MPO TIP; and
WHEREAS	the MPO Technical Committee has recommended the adoption of the TIP amendment by the MPO Policy Committee; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

The MPO Policy Committee hereby amends the FY 2021-2024 MPO Transportation Improvement Program to include the projects listed in "Attachment A".
