#815COUNTS - ILLINOIS CENSUS OFFICE AGREES!



As a regional planning commission, Region 1 Planning 2020 CENSUS Council coordinates multi-jurisdictional and long-term projects and planning. As such, the Council formed the <u>Regional Complete Count Committee</u> in June 2019. The Committee is facilitating efforts between the Illinois Complete Count Commission, U.S. Census Bureau, and local Complete Count Committees in Boone, DeKalb, Ogle, Stephenson, and Winnebago Counties.

By coordinating ideas and events, resource-sharing, and jointly combating misinformation, the Committee looks to maximize Census participation and prevent an undercount within the region. As part of the Committee's mission to streamline efforts and leverage resources to more efficiently promote a complete and accurate count for the 2020 Decennial Census, Region 1 Planning Council was identified to apply for regional funding from the Illinois Department of Human Services for 2020 Census outreach.

Today, <u>Illinois Department of Human Services</u> named Region 1 Planning Council as the Northern Region Regional Intermediary for the Illinois Census Office's 2020 Census Grant Program. As a result, the Council will receive \$920,000 in funding to reinvest in Northern Illinois to encourage a complete and accurate 2020 Census count. Much of the funding will be redistributed to sub-awardees to assist with 2020 Census outreach efforts.

The census is used to determine how billions of dollars in federal funding are assigned to support local programs and services, how many congressional representatives exist for the state and the drawing of congressional districts, and to inform business decisions that affect the state and local economy. Each person counted by the census represents the potential gain or loss of approximately \$1,535 of federal funding for the community.
