Mr. Donovan provided a brief overview and presentation regarding the R1PC MPO Federal Certification Review. Purpose of Review

- No less than once every four years MPOs designated as a Transportation Management Area (TMA) undergo a Federal Certification Review to determine if the process meets the requirements of applicable provisions of Federal Transportation Law
- Opportunity to enhance and refine planning process

- Safety for all motorized and no-motorized users
- Economic vitality including global competitiveness

### Scope of Review

Mr. Donovan stated that the R1PC Staff is top notch and are producing impressive documents/plans and that are becoming best practices. The top five (5) priority items that are reviewed during the Certification are the following:

- 1. MPO Structure and Administration
- 2. Performance Based Planning and Programming
- 3. MTP Transportation Plan
- 4. Program Development
- 5. Public Participation and Civil Rights

Upon completion of the Federal Certification Review, the final report will cover topic areas:

- Potential Findings
- Commendations for Best Practices
- Recommendations for Improvement

A motion to approve R1PC MPO Resolution #2019-13 was made by City of Rockford; second motion was made by Boone County. Motion carried unanimously (8-0).

#### MPO PERFORMANCE MEASURES (SAFETY PERFORMANCE TARGETS) - MPO RESOLUTION 2019-14:

Mr. Diipla provided a brief summary regarding federally required performance measure categories from the FAST-Act. Safety performance measures targets must be established by the MPO no later than January 19, 2020. Mr. Diipla referenced handout "MPO Performance Measures" and provided a brief summary and stated that after review and research staff recommends support of the IDOT 2% reduction regarding safety targets.

A motion to approve R1PC MPO Resolution #2019-14 was made by RMTD; second motion was made by City of Belvidere. Motion carried unanimously (8-0).

### 7. MPO TRANSPORTATION ALTERNATIVES PROGRAM (TAP):

Mr. Dunn provided a brief summary and update regarding the current STBG and TAP funds and scoring criteria that has been approved by the MPO Technical Committee and MPO Policy Committee. The five (5) projects that have been submitted for TAP funds through the most recent call for projects are as follows:

- 1. City of Rockford Spring Creek Road to U of I College of Medicine Connection
- 2. Winnebago County Bell School Road Sidewalk
- 3. Winnebago County Perryville Bike Path
- 4. City of Belvidere Bellwood & Belvidere High School Detention Ponds
- 5. Boone County Conservation District South Piscasaw Creek Connection

A summary of the two (2) motions that took place at the MPO Technical Committee earlier this morning was provided:

- 1<sup>st</sup> motion to affirm the ATC recommendation ranking City of Rockford project as number 1, and Boone County project as number 2. Motion was passed by majority 1 abstain, 9 Ayes, 6 Nayes; majority rules the Ayes have it.
- 2<sup>nd</sup> motion was made by Boone County to approve the project chosen using the Scoring Criteria adopted by the MPO Policy Committee, second motion was made by Boone County Conservation District – 1 Abstain, 6 Ayes, 9 Nayes; majority rules the Nayes have it.

There was a Q&A and discussion held amongst MPO Policy members and R1PC staff regarding the R1PC Scoring Criteria process. Discussion continued amongst the Policy Committee on how to program TAP funds and proposed alternatives for funding multiple projects submitted for consideration were examined.

Mayor Jury stated to table the matter and have a formal resolution at the December 2019 meeting. 1<sup>st</sup> motion to table the matter was made by the City of Belvidere, second motion was made by Winnebago County. Motion carried unanimously (8-0)
