The ramp work on I-39 has been completed.

Mr. DeLille reported that on October 6<sup>th</sup>-7<sup>th</sup> IDOT will be hosting the IDOT Fall Planning Conference in Moline, IL. The agenda for the event is available. The evaluation of the 2016 cycle of the ITEP have been completed. The announcement date has not yet been released on the award. With the new Accountability and Transparency Acts, IDOT is setting up an electronic database portal. MPOs and local governments will need to register if they receive any state and federal funding. It will be an ongoing process.

#### 3.30 Federal Highway Administration, Illinois Division:

The Proposed Rulemaking System Performance Measures dealing with freight and congestion management has been closed. The final rule will most likely be released in a few months. The comment period for the Proposed Rulemaking for MPO Coordination has been closed with over 500 comments were submitted. The Council of Environmental Quality has released a final guidance on the incorporation of greenhouse gas emissions and climate change consideration in the NEPA process, the effective date is rather quickly. Projects that are advancing now with have to consider those element, there is a grandfathered in.

# 3.34 Rockford Metropolitan Agency for Planning:

Mr. Diipla reported that work on the update to RMAP Human Services Transportation Plan (HSTP) has begun. Based on recommendations by FHWA and FTA in the certification review, RMAP will update the HSTP by July 1st, 2017. The plan will be looking at current public transportation gaps, workforce development, etc. A survey will be posted in next few weeks, posted on website and sent to the RMAP email list.

Mr. Belle reported that the Bicycle & Pedestrian Advisory Committee (BPAC) met for the initial kick-off meeting. The future meetings of the BPAC will focus on visioning setting, goal setting, and strategies.

Ms. Ma reported that the Annual List of Obligated Projects, formerly titled the Federal List of Obligated Projects, will be submitted to IDOT by the end of the month. Ms. Ma also reported on the three administrative modification to the FY2016 – 2020 Transportation Improvement Project in the last month. The three projects moved out of Advanced Construction status, the projects include Cunningham Rd Bridge, Latham Rd, and reconstruction on N Main St/IL-2.

Mr. Diipla reported that RMAP staff members, Colin Belle and Sydney Turner will be presenting on the Bicycle & Pedestrian Plan and the Greenways Plan at the IDOT Fall Planning Conference. RMAP will also be attending the RHA Celebration Event tonight.

#### 4. FUNCTIONAL CLASSIFICATION SYSTEM UPDATE – RESOLUTION 2016-9:

Mr. Diipla stated that a meeting on September 15, 2016 was held with representatives from IDOT and local partner agencies to discuss the most recent changes to the Function Classification system. There was a general agreement, with only minor technical changes, for the proposed revisions IDOT has made through the five-year review process. It should be noted that minor collectors in urbanized areas are eligible for federal funding, but minor collectors outside the adjusted urbanized areas would not be eligible for federal funding. When a link is added or reclassified as an "Other Principle Arterial", the link is automatically added to the National Highway

System, and vice versa. The update process will be on a five-year rolling basis in the future with the next anticipated update in 2020.

Mr. Diipla entertains a motion to approve the recommendation of Resolution 2016-9. The first motion was made by Brent Anderson, City of Belvidere Public Works Dept.; second motion was made by Jeremy Carter, City of Rockford Public Works Dept. The motion carries by unanimous voice vote.

#### 5. PROGRESS REPORTS:

#### 6. OTHER BUSINESS:

Mr. Carter proposed that the RMAP Technical Committee prepare a letter to the Illinois Secretary of State to add flashing yellow lights and roundabouts to the DMV Driver's License Exam, due to the lack of education on these traffic control devices. Mr. DeLille added that there has been discussion at the state level of how to update education programs. Mr. Diipla stated that he would relay this information to Mr. Dunn about potentially presenting the idea of the letter to the RMAP Policy Committee. RMAP will report back to the Technical Committee.
