Mr. Dunn stated that Jon Paul Diipla is the Director of Metropolitan Planning Organization. Gary McIntyre recently retired and Michael Hren is finishing up his last few weeks as he moves on to a new position he's accepted in California.

5. OVERVIEW OF MPO, EDD & RPC OPERATIONS

Mr. Dunn stated that he was brought in a few years ago to replace Mr. Steve Ernst and assist in moving the organization forward to an RPC organization. Mr. Dunn referenced the acronym list which was provided to the members and provided a brief summary of each acronym.

Mr. Dunn stated that during his first year he researched whether the region needed an organization such as an RPC. Mr. Dunn provided a brief summary on the primary goals of an RPC, MPO and EDD organization.

RPC – a Regional Planning Council (RPC) is an organization that provides streamlined tech assistance on projects to procure, in conjunction with a legislative advocacy board, larger state and federal investment back to the area. These services include grant writing, transportation modeling, economic/data analysis, and comprehensive planning. An RPC represents member local governments within a defined region and can also be referred to as a regional planning commission, regional council or council of governments.

What is included:

- Transportation planning, including a Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO)
- Economic development planning, research and grant writing through an Economic Development District (EDD)
- Other services to be determined

MPO – The RPC would include a Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO), which is an agency created by federal law to provide local elected officials input into the planning and implementation of federal transportation funds to urbanized areas above 50,000 population. MPOs must plan for regional transportation planning expenditures and are responsible for the continuing, cooperative, and comprehensive transportation planning process for their urbanized area. The Rockford Metropolitan Agency for Planning is the MPO for the Rockford urbanized area. That function would remain with the RPC. In addition, MPO staff would be able to provide other transportation planning services to partners outside the Rockford urbanized area.

EDD – The RPC would include an Economic Development District (EDD), an agency that oversees a federally recognized regional economic development plan required for certain federal grants. The EDD provides a forum for public and private sector partners to plan regionally significant economic development initiatives and partner with the federal government. The EDD can also provide research, technical assistance, and grant writing services to local governments, economic development organizations, and eventually a regional economic development marketing organization. The Economic Development District of Northern Illinois is the EDD for Boone, McHenry and Winnebago Counties. That function would remain with the RPC. In addition, EDD staff would be able to provide economic development research and grant writing service to other member governments.

An RPC

- saves taxpayers \$ by reducing duplication in government
- is open to participation and aligns existing functions
- is a platform for governments to handle regional issues

An RPC is NOT

- a new layer of government
- replacing existing organizations
- able to overrule local government authority

A brief discussion took place among members regarding a Regional Planning Council.

Mr. Dunn stated that the following are Open Action Items in progress and Next Steps for Regional Planning Council:

- Joint County resolution creating County-formed RPC through Illinois State Statue
- Transition of WinGIS to RPC
- Fiscal Agency from City of Rockford to independent operation with third-party providers
- Facility improvements with new City of Rockford lease and understanding of "Design Center" oversight and role
- Creation of COG Legislative Function and partner building with government leaders outside of Winnebago/Boone
