3.15 Village of Roscoe:

Mr. Gill reported that Village has a 1% sale tax referendum on the March 15th ballot which would be fully dedicated to road infrastructure. Additionally, there are several site proposals under review for properties on Rockton Rd near the I-90 interchange, including two new diesel stations.

Mr. Baer reported that the Spring Creek Road work is complete, with only minor punch items left for this Spring. The City of Rockford will take care of the remaining resurfacing. Work on the Fuller Creek project, on the east side of the Village of Winnebago, will be begin once weather begins to improve; work will involve a crossing of Westfield Road, but not should not have major impact on other roads. Smaller work projects have begun.

3.26 IDOT, Division of Urban Program Planning:

Mr. DeLille reported that the state-wide freight plan is almost complete, the fiscally constrained portion is still being determined. The draft freight plan is available for review on IDOT's website. In order to complete the fiscal constrained portion, there will be a call for project opening on February 16th with a deadline of April 6th. The Illinois State Freight

Advisory Council will be reviewing and ranking the projects received with a tentative award announcement in May. There will be several applicant workshops scheduled for throughout the state. Additionally, the statewide rail plan is available for review and comments on the IDOT website; comments can be submitted online. The next federal performance management target setting deadline for states is May. There is currently a draft intergovernmental agreement between IDOT, the MPO, and public transit operator being reviewed in relation to the federal performance management requirements. IDOT is in the process of developing a competitive call for projects process for the Special Planning and Research (SPR) funds. IDOT's long-range transportation plan is being reviewed internal by IDOT staff. Also, IDOT is currently in the process of updating their website.

3.34 Rockford Metropolitan Agency for Planning:

Mr. Diipla reported that the RMAP will be submitting comments on the state-wide freight plan and can incorporate any of the partner agencies' comments; comments are due by February 23rd. In relation to the Illinois Transportation Enhancement Program (ITEP), RMAP is in the process of reviewing the applications submitted from our region based on IDOT's selection criteria. The Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) applications are due by March 30th. The MPO Policy Committee Meeting will be held every two months moving forward to correspond with the Regional Planning Council's Board meetings. The two upcoming MPO Policy Committee meetings will be February 22nd and April 26th. At the April MPO Policy Committee, RMAP will be presenting a resolution for the adoption of the Alternative Transportation Committee. The committee will be combining the functions of the existing Mobility Subcommittee with active transportation functions outlined in the Bicycle & Pedestrian Plan. At the last MPO Policy Committee, RMAP received direction to revisit the Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) selection criteria, which has already gone through internal review. The MPO Policy Committee has requested an ad hoc committee to be formed to review the updated selection criteria. The ad hoc committee will be put together within the next to couple of months and a call for projects for TAP funds will occur after ITEP is awarded. The Public Participation Plan (PPP) public comment period will be closing tomorrow, February 16th, 2018. A recommendation on the adoption of the PPP will asked for at the next Technical Committee meeting with the tentative adoption of the plan at the April MPO Policy Committee meeting.

4. NATIONAL HIGHWAY SYSTEM DESIGNATIONS – RMAP RESOLUTION 2018-3:

Mr. Belle provided a brief presentation on the proposed change to the National Highway System (NHS) from IDOT and what the NHS designation means. Additionally, he discussed the 2015-2016 Functional Classification update process, which initiated the update to the NHS, the NHS update submittal process, the design standards of NHS roads, and additional funding opportunities for designated roads.

A brief discussion took place among the members and several questions were asked about the signage requirements of NHS roadways.

With no further comments, Mr. Diipla asked for a recommendation from the RMAP Technical Committee. He entertained a motion to approve. Motioned by Brent Anderson, City of Belvidere and seconded by James Richer II, Village of Machesney Park. The Motion carried by unanimous voice vote.

5. TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP) AMENDMENT PROCEDURE – RMAP RESOLUTION 2018-4:

Mr. Diipla explained the formalization of the amendment and administrative modification to the TIP, as well as further defines administration modifications and timeframes for requests. Changes to the previous draft document included streamlining of the layout and language.

With no further comments, Mr. Diipla asked for a recommendation from the RMAP Technical Committee. He entertained a motion to approve. Motioned by Scott Capovilla, City of Rockford Community Development Dept. and seconded by Brent Anderson, City of Belvidere. The Motion carried by unanimous voice vote.

Mr. Diipla reported that Region 1 Planning Council and Transform Rockford will be hosting a Community Conversation on the RMAP Bicycle and Pedestrian Plan on February 28^{th} from 5:30-7:00 P.M. At a previous Technical Committee meeting, the City of Rockford had requested a discussion on Senate 14-51 Small Wireless Facilities Deployment Act. A procedural hold has been placed on the Act. No additional updates were provided.
